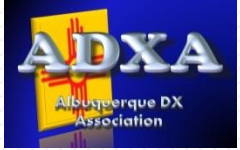

- Electronic Logging
- Logbook of The World
- Calendar for DX, Contests, etc.
- Electronic Manuals/Publications

- New vs. Used
- Components Lineup



Desktop vs. Laptop

- Uses Less Space
- Has Multiple Monitor Outputs
- Uses a Larger Keyboard
- More Bang for the Buck
- Leave Connected “Permanently”
- Consider Refurbished PC
- Multiple Internal & External Slots
- Go with Internal USB Card(s)

New vs. Used

- Lots of “Off Lease” Available
- Power User vs. “Normal”?
- Type A or B Personality?
- \$150 vs. \$1,500?
- Loggers & HT Programmers
Don't Need Much Power

Using This Tool Wisely

- BACK-UP “Resistance is Futile”
- Every PC Will Fail
- Solid State Drives Fail
- Bad Stuff Happens on AC Line
- You Spilled What into the PC?



Back-up Strategy

- If It's Important, Back-up NOW!
- Use an Automated System
- OneDrive Does Work But,
No-No for Live Databases N1MM+
- Test Any B/U System!!!!

Browser Power

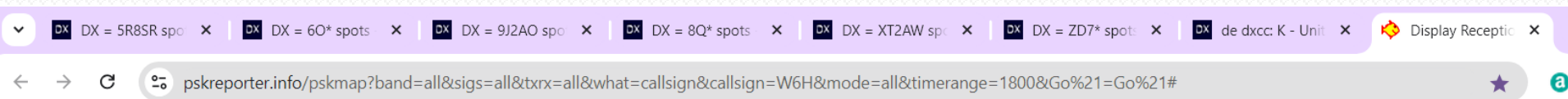
- I Supported MS Windows
- I Had to Use Internet Explorer
- I Had to Manually Update PC's
- I Built My First PC (H8) in 1979
- I Use the Chrome Browser

Browser Power

- Stop Fearing Cookies!
- Stop Cleaning the Cache Nightly
- Use Chrome's Features
- Passwords Are Safe
- Google Tells You if Compromised

Browser Power

- Chrome Crosses Devices
- Bookmarks & Passwords on All
- Calendar, E-Mail, Contacts “ “
- Use Multiple Tabs



Browser Power

- CNTRL+H for History (Handy)
- Use Multiple Profiles
Work, Personal, Amateur Radio
- A Single Letter Brings Up
C=Calendar
- N=NG3K DXpeditions
- A=Amazon
- D=DXWatch
- E=Elecraft

Browser Power

- Use Bookmarks Efficiently
- One Instance for DXWatch
All Current DX in Multiple Tabs
CNTRL+PAGEUP/PAGEDOWN
Moves Rapidly from Tab to Tab
See How Quickly This is Done
- Have Other “Standard” Windows

Browser Power

- Long List of Keyboard Shortcuts

TRL + T. Open a New Tab.

CTRL + W. Close current tab.

CTRL + F5 Refresh Tab

CTRL + TAB. Switch between open tabs.

CTRL + N. Open a new browser window.

F11 Go Fullscreen. And Many More

Touch Typing

- Eyes on the Screen
- Index Fingers on the Home Keys
- HUGE Difference in Rapid Logging
- Much Easier to Copy CW
- Much Easier/Faster for Everything!
- Watch TV While Typing (Football)

Touch Typing

- Essential Skill for Contesting
- Increases Logging Accuracy
- More Comfortable
- Better Ergonomics
- Better, Faster, Cheaper (?) Intel

On-Line Receivers

- Anybody Have Any Noise on RX?
- Are Some Stations Difficult Copy?
- Do You Participate in Nets?
- Have You Heard “The Utah SDR”?
- Does Anyone Use their Own RX?

WebSDR

- Software Defined Radio Receiver
- Many Simultaneous Listeners
- Each Tunes Independently
- First Used for EME
- 100 kbps Per Listener
- Does Not Support Internet Explorer

WebSDR

If you don't get audio, try the following:

- At the top right, click the 4 vertical dots, and then Settings.
- At the bottom, click Advanced.
- Under "Privacy and security," click Site settings.
- Select "Sound"
- Select "Add" and enter "http://*"




WebSDR

- Works With Many Smartphones
- Use FAQ if Having Problems
- Decode Digital by Using a Virtual Audio Cable to Application

WebSDR

- Fill In for Propagation Gaps
 - Overcome Your Local Noise
 - Record and Playback Your TX Audio
 - Record Other's TX Audio
- Explain What You Are Hearing
- Provide Technical Assistance

Troubleshooting PCs

- Same as Radios—Logic is Key
- So are Basic PC & Windows Knowledge
- PCs are Another Tool
